



BACKPACK PROGRAM

The Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank BackPack Program is an outreach donor-funded program designed to help fill the void for low-income children who are at risk of missing meals over the weekend or during holidays when they are not in school receiving free or reduced price lunches through the National School Lunch Program. BackPacks are filled with 10-12 nutritious food items and then distributed to at-risk children enrolled in the program in select elementary schools. The backpacks are discreetly sent home with children in pre-K through fifth grade on Friday and returned back to school empty on Monday morning.
